Your Surgery of choice

As of the end of February 2024, The Cranborne Practice currently has over **12,600 registered patients**, an increase of 3.8% over the past 12 months.

Data from NHS England shows that over the six-month period ending January 2024, the Practice carried out **63,430 appointments**. Of these:

- 69.9% of these were held in person (face to face) with a healthcare professional
- 27,678 were consultations with a GP
- More than 80% of GP consultations were carried out within 24 hours of patient contact.

Spring 2024 COVID Booster programme

Spring COVID-19 booster vaccinations are now being offered to patients who are aged 75 old or over, live in a care home for older adults or are aged 12 or over and have a weakened immune system.

You will be contacted if your NHS record suggests you may be eligible for a seasonal spring COVID-19 vaccine. Appointments are offered at drive-through clinics at the Community Vaccination Centre based next to our Lake Road Surgery in Verwood. These clinics are scheduled for Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evenings commencing the 22nd of April through to early June.

Patients with a mobile phone registered with their practice will be sent an SMS text message with details of how to book. You will be contacted by phone if you do not have a mobile phone registered with us.

Please wait to be contacted by the NHS if you're eligible. For guidance for people whose immune system means they are at higher risk please visit the Gov.UK website here >>

We look forward to taking care of your vaccinations

By the end of January 2024, overall in Dorset, more that 217,000 people had been vaccinated in the COVID-19 Autumn Booster Vaccination Programme. That is 64% of eligible patients. Of the 5,233 eligible patients registered with our Practice, 71.1 percent took up of the offer and we thank them.

At the same time, more than 265,000 people across Dorset received a Winter Flu vaccination. For patients registered with our Practice, 6,377 took up the offer.

You have a choice in where to receive your seasonal vaccines, but we hope you choose The Cranborne Practice.

We continue to have direct access to your medical records, so your immunisations can be immediately added to your patient record.

We still ensure continuity of care for our patients and carers - we already know you, and you know us!

We can inform you if you are entitled to other vaccinations, such as measles, shingles or pneumonia.

The Cranborne Practice pioneered drive-through clinics, and we continue to provide this service. Our patients have found this service very convenient, quick and efficient.

Some patients have asked about the cost. There is no cost to the patients for this vaccination, however The Cranborne Practice does receive a small payment from the NHS each time we give a vaccination. We reinvest this money into providing local GP services.
